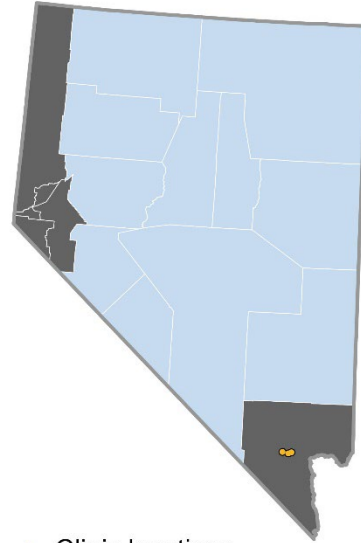


Southern Nevada Health District

Southern Nevada Health District (SNHD) is a decentralized state health department that has been delivering Title X services since 1983. It delivers services to more than 73 percent of the state's population through two direct service sites and one mobile clinic.¹

- ▶ Number of family planning (FP) encounters – 5,810
- ▶ FP users with incomes below 100% Federal Poverty Level (FPL) – 1,738 (55%); all FP users with incomes below 250% of FPL – 2,753 (87%)

Overview of Services Offered

As a Title X recipient, Southern Nevada Health District provides a broad range of FP services including pregnancy prevention and birth spacing, pregnancy testing and counseling, assistance to achieve pregnancy, basic infertility services, sexually transmitted infection (STI) services, and other preconception health services. The services are voluntary, confidential, and provided regardless of ability to pay.³ The infographic below is an Overview of Services Offered within the SNHD network. Innovations in Practice



Southern Nevada Health District understands the importance of integrating client services to provide quality STI care in a timely manner. SNHD uses a screening tool in its electronic health record to screen clients for STI and HIV across service programs. If a client is identified as being at risk of an STI, both clinics can run testing on-site for immediate answers. Then, clients can use SNHD's onsite pharmacy to start on treatment or PrEP the same day. SNHD also uses its STI surveillance team to find difficult-to-reach clients who need treatment and provides behavioral health program referrals for anyone who tests positive for an STI or HIV. Through integrating care, SNHD streamlines the STI treatment and prevention process for clients, saving them both time and money.

Did You Know?



Southern Nevada Health District implemented pre-visit planning that includes a daily huddle to help staff prepare for client visits and use clients' time effectively. Staff review client information two days ahead of a scheduled visit to confirm if clients have health insurance, to review the reason for the visit, and to identify what additional information may be needed to ensure a successful visit. On the day of the visit, staff huddle to discuss each client and create a plan for the day so that all staff are on the same page. This enables SNHD to identify potential client needs, so more than one issue can be addressed in a single visit.



To expand access to youth, SNHD plans to apply for grants to revive its Teen Pregnancy Prevention program. Through this program, SNHD would provide youth access to POWER (planning without exam required) visits. These types of visits reduce barriers for youth who are interested in STI and birth control services, but are uncomfortable with pelvic exams.



SNHD participates in Clark County's Mobile Health Collaborative project, which brings organizations together to provide services to people experiencing homelessness. Through the collaborative, SNHD participates in health fairs using its mobile clinic for outreach, contraceptive services and family planning counseling, education, and referrals.
